

You Can Work Anywhere in the World!

- **Key Points:** The culture clash between expatriates and local workers is sometimes far more severe than we might expect. Too often, international relocators receive insufficient pre-departure education. This program is a new kind of international relocation training, more systematic in learning and focused on actual business applications of cultural understanding for each target country.
- **Objectives:**
 - To be free from one's own native cultural lens
 - To obtain a professional stance in doing business in the multicultural/global arena
 - To understand how rules (both written & unspoken) are different if cultural codes are different
 - To grasp the basics in cross-cultural communication
 - To learn three patterns of solutions for cross-cultural conflict
 - To identify the code of the target country and understand what the local rules (written & unspoken) are
 - To become knowledgeable of similarities and differences between your own culture and that of the local people
 - To obtain skills to manage differences (with cases & role playing)
 - To understand what type of boss/leader is most appealing to locals
 - To learn what will motivate and what will discourage locals (with cases and cultural tools)
 - To become familiarized with the effective problem solving method
 - To learn how to improve the relationship between the HQ & locals
 - To practice bottom-line manners and etiquette
